Please do not submit any additional letters of recommendation or supplemental application materials other than those specifically requested in the application checklist.

Please be aware that prior to final selections TLW will make every effort to communicate with the appropriate representatives from each school confirming the eligibility of the applicant's status in order to participate in the program. Since the program depends on the school's participation and approval from the district with regard to absences, we need concurrence with school administration.

We strongly recommend that you keep a copy of your application and all submitted materials.

TUITION AND FINANCIAL AID

Tuition

Since the 2021 TLW class will be "virtual" until it is deemed safe by the schools and city officials to meet in person a discounted tuition will be offered. The discounted tuition for the TLW Program is \$425.00. The \$25.00 application fee will be credited to your tuition. \$100.00 of the tuition must be a sponsorship from a community business or community member that the student solicits. \$200 of the \$400 tuition is due by the 2nd class on March 1st with the balance due by the 4th class on May 10th. There are no refunds.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Please read requirements carefully:

- 1. Must be classified as a sophomore or junior in high school as of September 1st of the current year.
- 2. Participate in the Teen Leadership Retreat in February.
- 3. Participate in a Teen Leadership Waco sponsored community service event.
- 4. Attend a minimum of six monthly workshops; there are eight workshops in all. (Unexcused absences may result in termination from the program).

Please answer the following, required as part of your application. We recommend that you spend the majority of your time on these answers. The selection committee weighs these answers heavily when reviewing your application. Please provide thoughtful and insightful answers.

- A. About You: answer the following questions (each answer should be 2-5 sentences)
 - 1. Leadership: Provide information about yourself as a student Academic, Athletic, School/Class Leadership Positions (extra-curricular school activities, interests, awards, and special accomplishments).
 - 2. Service: List your volunteer experience and/or employment history. Also, list any other community involvement, community recognition or special accomplishments.
 - 3. Using a few phrases or adjectives, describe yourself.
- B. Leadership: answer the following questions (each answer should be 2-5 sentences)
 - 1. What are the five most important characteristics of a leader?
 - 2. What part of being a leader comes most naturally to you and what part is most challenging for you?
 - 3. What would you like to accomplish by the time you retire?
 - 4. Who is someone that you admire and why do you admire him/her?

- C. Essay: Please choose 2 of the following topics and write an essay on each (500 words or less). Clearly and fully identify your position(s), use clear examples, explain your reasoning.
 - 1. Are school uniforms beneficial?
 - 2. Are we too dependent on our computers?
 - 3. Is homework helpful or harmful?
 - 4. Is the cost of college too much?
 - 5. Should schools require a foreign language or physical education?
 - 6. Does technology make us more alone?
 - 7. What should be done to stop cyber-bullying?
 - 8. How should we prevent future mass shootings?
 - 9. Do leaders have moral obligations?
 - 10. What can older people learn from your generation?
 - 11. What has COVID-19 taught you about yourself, your community and the world we live in?
